Marjorie Agosin Visit

Award-winning poet, fiction writer, and memoirist **Marjorie Agosin** will both meet with graduate students and deliver an open lecture on Tuesday, 5 October. At 4:00 pm, she will interact with graduate students in the English conference room, 3001A Wescoe. At 7:00 pm, she will address "Writing an Activist's Life" in the Centennial Room of the Kansas Union. A book signing will follow. Agosin is Professor of Spanish at Wellesley College where she teaches courses in Spanish language and Latin-American literature, but she is widely recognized for her work in numerous other fields, including human rights, women's studies, and Jewish studies. Her book, *Of Earth and Sea: A Chilean Memoir*, recently won the International Latino Book Award for biography. Her most recent book is *The Light of Desire/La Luz del Deseo*.
